Major advanced manufacturing investment in Hamilton

HAMILTON, ON - May 29, 2009 – Today, in keeping with its commitment to growing its advanced manufacturing sector, the City of Hamilton congratulates Jayne Industries in consolidating their operations (including a subsidiary from Burlington) in Hamilton.

“We are so pleased that Jayne is investing in Hamilton and providing some much needed advanced manufacturing jobs to our city,” says Mayor Fred Eisenberger. “This is once again an example that Hamilton is quickly becoming known across the country as a place to invest and of course we will do our best to facilitate investment to move our city forward.”

Jayne Industries is a leader in the North American market for engineering and manufacturing of refractory anchoring systems for over 40 years and provides services in refractory anchoring systems, steel fabrication and engineering solutions. Their investment in Hamilton is both in the area of business expansion and retention; including moving their Burlington based subsidiary (formerly known as Darcam) into a newly purchased fabrication facility at 512 Seaman Street in Stoney Creek and moving and expanding their fabrication operations from 550 Seaman Street to the new 512 Seaman Street location. Their head office operations continue at 550 Seaman Street. This consolidation has involved a total expansion of their operations from 40,000 square-feet to 100,000 square-feet with plans to increase their full-time work force by 10-20% over the next several months.

“Hamilton is a strategic choice for our operations,” said owner Duncan Robson. “Advanced manufacturing continues to be a strong part of Hamilton’s economy and we are thrilled to make a home in Hamilton and play our part in moving the city’s economy forward.”
